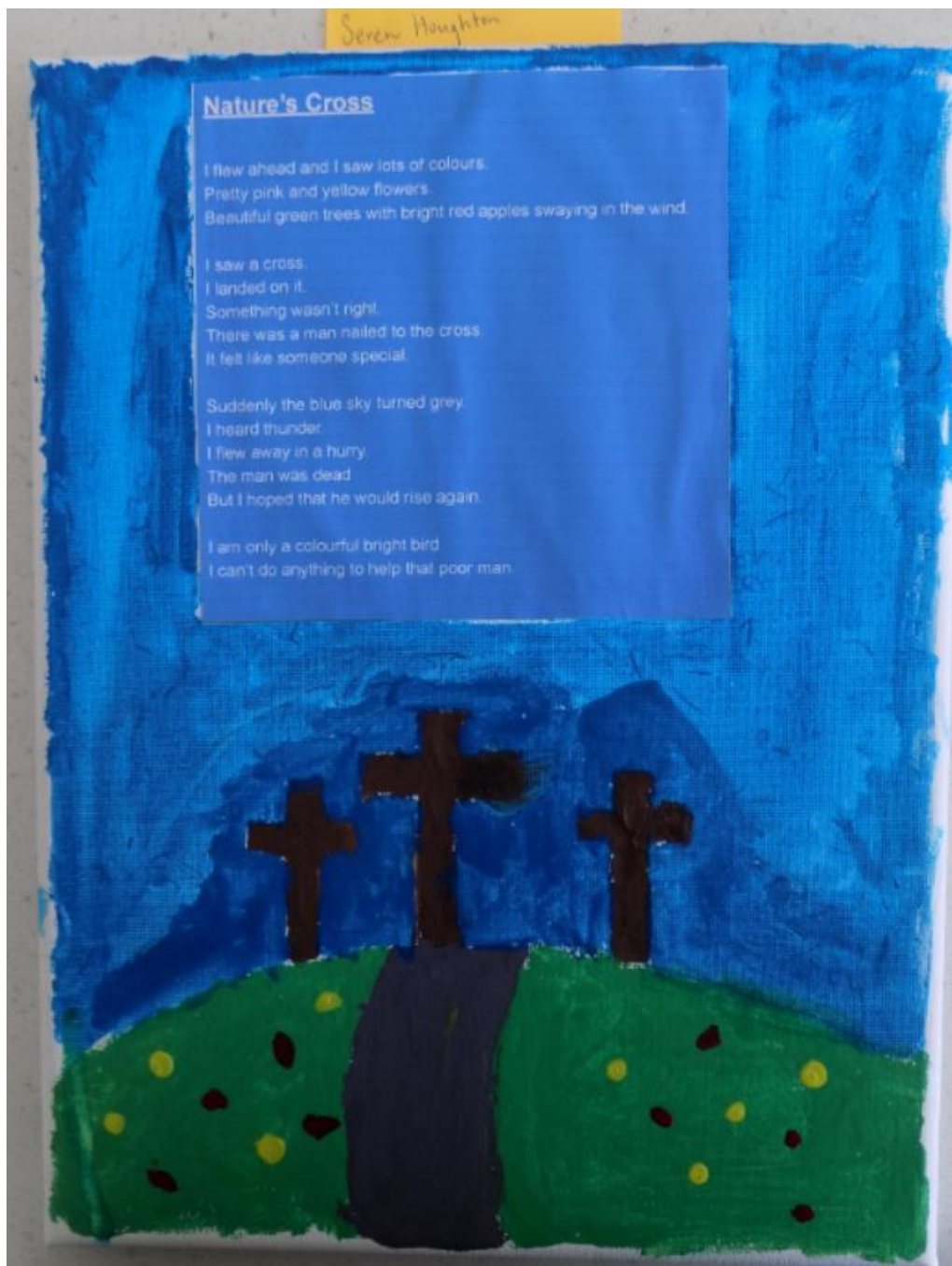



Thank you to all the children who entered 2023 Spirited Arts Competition in association with NATRE.
