Key Question:

Was Jesus
the
Messiah?



Prior Knowledge

Pupils will know that:

The Big Story of the Bible and The Big Frieze.
Jesus was Jewish.

Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh.

Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.

The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' — a messiah.

Christians believe that Jesus was the one who fitted these expectations, and that he is the Messiah. (Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah.)

Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.

Subject Vocabulary

Incarnation	God the Son in human flesh as Jesus Christ.
Messiah	the promised deliverer of the Jewish nation prophesied in the Bible
Anointed	literally- to rub oil onto someone as part of a religious ceremony To give divine or holy respect to someone.
Saviour	a person who saves someone or something from danger or difficulty. (in Christianity) God or Jesus Christ as the redeemer of sin and saver of souls.
Prophecy	a prediction of what will happen in the future. A text that is telling about what will come about.
