Describe what a Sikh/non-Sikh might learn from a Sikh story

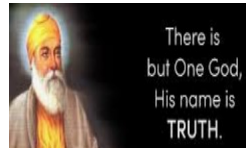
Stories can teach Sikhs about what is important in life and relate this to non-Sikhs.

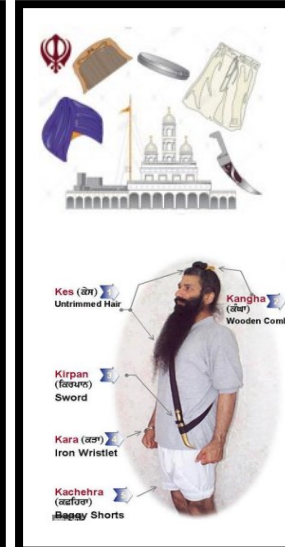
Prayer and worship

Subject Vocabulary

Commitment	being devoted to something
Symbolism	use of symbols to represent ideas
5 Ks	Kesh (uncut hair) Kara (a steel bracelet) Kanga (a wooden comb) Kachera (cotton underwear) Kirpan (steel sword)
Sikh	people who adhere to Sikhism,
Sewa	helping others without any reward or personal gain.
Langar	The langar (or free kitchen) was introduced by Guru Nanak. He offered free meals to everyone, regardless of their caste, gender or wealth. It is a place where everyone gathered and ate together.
