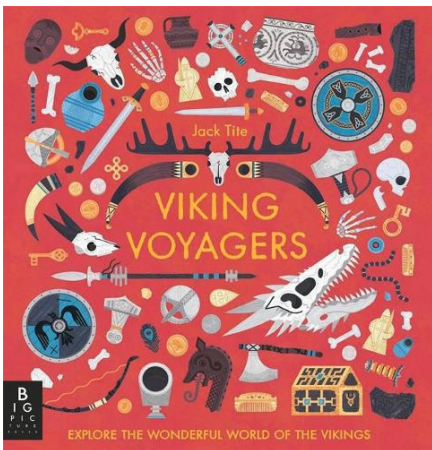
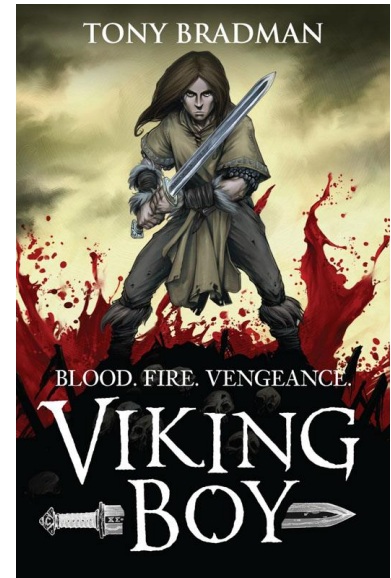


**Viking Boy – Tony Bradman**
